Programs

We invite successful and well-known professional photographers to present at our meetings to share their work, provide inspiration and open our eyes to new types of photography.



They also give insights to technical skills such as post processing with Photoshop, Lightroom and various photography software plug-ins and applications. Our members are encouraged to share their expertise and work at our "RCC Magazine" meetings.

Expanding our horizons

To further broaden our exposure to other types of photography, we have established a relationship with a UK-based photographic society. We share our programs and resources as well as conduct joint meetings throughout the year that allow our members to get to know each other.

We also look for opportunities to show our work through annual exhibits such as "Art in the Park" and locations such as the "Stable" in Ridgewood.

Workshops and Field Trips

Workshops provide hands-on opportunities to delve deeper and hone technical skills such as macro photography and portraiture. These are held outside of our traditional meetings.

Field Trips give us a chance to spend time with other members photographing in different and sometimes challenging settings that we might not have visited on our own.



Monthly field trips also offer an opportunity to learn from others in a friendly environment as we work to improve our photographic skills.

Other Activities

To further broaden our skills, we establish one to two **Creative Challenges** each year for our members to take part in. These have included creating our own personal websites, recovering and restoring old family photographs, and putting together individual books to highlight our work that are then shared with club members at large.

Our **Book Club** focuses on different photographers and subjects within the photography realm. Interested members meet three to four times a year to discuss the readings and share their opinions.
