Purpose of the member survey


Based on general feedback from our town hall meeting there was a need to get more specific information.



Question 3: Do you have experience in:






Question 4: What are your hobbies and interests other than photography?






Question 5: What type of computer do you use?






Question 6: What camera gear do you use?


