
On page 7 are a some photos and a few words about this editors trip to California and Oregon.





Our trip to Northern California and Oregon



When my wife and I left for a trip to northern California and Oregon, I decided that I would not spend the entire day from sunrise to sunset taking pictures. But when you are

surrounded by so much beautiful scenery, it's hard to resist taking out the camera. By the end of the trip, I had taken 500 digital pictures.

Our trip began in San Francisco. Our hotel was located across the street from Golden State Park, a great place for a gardener/photographer. The flowers in the park are just spectacular. There is this conservatory that had the most beautiful dahlia collection. The Japanese Tea Garden was equally beautiful.



The next day we got into our rental car and headed north across the Golden Gate Bridge along US1. The scenery across the bridge was very nice, but for the next 20 to 30 miles we still had a feeling that we were in a metropolitan area. US 1 is a very winding road that snakes along the shore with many scenic stops, so many that we decided we couldn't make all the stops. Some of the nice towns we did stop in were Mendocino, Fort Bragg, Ferndale and Eureka, the last town in California before crossing over to Oregon.



There are number of lighthouses along the coast. The ones we liked best were


the Cape Blanco Lighthouse and the Heceta head light.

On the way back to San Francisco, we stopped at Redwood National
