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#### Need for Silence

There is an old Native American saying that is "you can never judge a man until you walk a mile in his shoes". While the saying does not fully apply to the situation I am about to describe it is close enough to allow me to use one of my favorite sayings.

I want you to walk a mile in a judge's shoes. When a judge is evaluating an image and developing the verbalization to describe the strong and weak points of the image he needs his full powers of concentration. That allows him to provide the best evaluation of the maker's image. You have no idea of how audience comments can break the concentration and rhythm of the judge unless you performed in the role of a judge. Simple whispers of things like "that's great" when you see an image that you like or a complaining comment like "oh" when you don't agree with a comment or score are distracting. Impeding the judge's visual observation and thought process is unfair both to the judge, who is trying very hard to do the best job he can, and to the person who submitted the image for evaluation. Consider also that the judge is generally under a rather severe time constraint and the more you interrupt his process the later you are sitting in your seat.

We, the audience, need to be sensitized to this and to attempt to do our best at controlling our natural inclination to verbally comment on the image or the judge's verbalization. The judge in an otherwise quiet room can pick up even a whisper. Judges and especially good judges are in short supply and we need to treat them with respect while they are judging if we want them to perform to their best. Most judges are more than willing to accept critical input after the event but not during it so please save your comments until the judging is completed.
