#### **MEETING PROGRAMS**

RCC meets the second, third and last Wednesday of each month (September — May) at 8 pm sharp. For those members who are not regular attendees, the meeting topics are either competitions or a program relevant to photography. Page 4 of this newsletter is a snapshot calendar for the year. Lou Kalmar, RCC's Programs organizer, is finalizing the programs, so we don't have a final listing at this time. Be sure to check the website for updates to the Programs as the dates approach. Last year we had Programs ranging from Commercial photography to Street photography to what a Photojournalist encounters to Travel photo destinations. #### COMPETITIONS

RCC competitions are yet another element of what RCC is about. For the well-seasoned photographer, club competitions are a way to get feedback about their standing in the club, and also to have their work regularly evaluated by a judge. For those photographers who just want to get critical feedback from judges who provide comments that can help improve their work, competitions are a great way to achieve that goal. All RCC members are eligible to compete. It costs nothing to enter, and it's all upside.

The categories are fully explained on the RCC website though here's the brief listing:

- Pictorial (almost anything goes)
- Nature (four defined subcategories)
- Print (color and b/w)
- Assigned Subject (see article below)

Complete information for entering images into competition (both projected and print) are on the RCC website. To make it user-friendly for newer members and those veteran members who have never entered images into competition, we're having a workshop on this subject on Friday, September 17. Check the website for complete information and to sign-up for this much requested workshop.

#### **ASSIGNED SUBJECTS**

This season RCC will have two assigned subject competitions. The first one — **Photojournalism** — will take place on February 9, 2011. It's not too early to begin thinking about and shooting for this exciting and important category of photography. Here's an excerpt of PSA's definition of the category:

"Photojournalism images shall consist of pictures or sequences with informative content and emotional impact, including human interest, documentary and spot news. The journalistic value of the photograph shall be considered over pictorial quality. In the interest of credibility, photographs which misrepresent the truth, such as manipulation to alter the subject matter, or situations which are set up for the purpose of photography, are unacceptable in Photojournalism."

The second assigned subject competition is on April 20, 2011 and the topic is **People at Work**. We're sure to have a lot of interesting and fun images for this competition.

Don't procrastinate. February 9th will be here before we know it.

## THE RCC SPONSOR PROGRAM

The Sponsor Program is alive and well and is a great resource for newer members. For those of you not familiar with it, here's a brief recap of it.

When you joined RCC, you were assigned a Sponsor. That person is your resource within RCC — a club mentor of sorts.
