Let's say you want to move only one slider back to its default and you don't remember what it was. Just double click on the slider handle and it will return to its default.

To Compete or Not to Compete

Sometimes I think the judge is out of this world and just because he doesn't like my photo, well I do! So what are we here for anyway...to get criticized and turned off by the judge's comments?

Well, actually, no. The benefits of entering into competitions most definitely outweigh the comments that I sometimes think are not justified. Most of the comments helped me to get my composition right. There really wasn't a composition in my photos when I started. Those comments about the one third, two thirds, the straight horizons, the terrible gray skies, should it be a vertical or a horizontal, the background is too distracting, you cut off the person's fingers or foot, fill the frame with your subject, over exposed or underexposed, and now even the digital images.... over saturated, too manipulated, etc. have been helpful. When I look through my lens the things that I have learned (*and it does take time to really learn and put into practice the things that I have heard over again from the competitions*), are right there. I automatically re-calculate my composition, concentrate on the straight image, move around so that I can frame the photo the way it would look best, try different ways, etc.

When I hear a judge say, "it is just a little too close to the edge, so I'll give it a 7 for now," and then sometimes that comment gets you a 9, or some stay at a 7. It is petty to think it was that close to getting a better score when in my eyes *it looked perfectly fine*. There are judges that don't see what you see in your photo, or it is not to their liking and that does not mean that it is not a great photo. It is only their opinion. Everything in the photo is acknowledged - the composition - the lighting, etc. and you feel that the judge is looking for something to criticize. Well in those cases, if you love your photo, just continue to love it. We really have to look at the total perspective here and what I mean is, again, the benefits of the critiquing outweigh the negatives you may receive from time to time. I find most of it to be helpful. You don't have to compete, but be there to enjoy everyone's images and don't be concerned about who has the highest score. RCC's goal is to encourage everyone, from the beginner to the very experienced. We most certainly want you to show your images, to enjoy photography, learn from each other and most of all, learn from ourselves. So don't let the judge's comments ruin your night or your purpose. It is just part of a learning curve, *so take the good and learn from it - and keep on photographing!*
